The court has generously sized single and couple flats and several cost effective studios and is located with level access available at the rear of the building which is set in beautiful landscaped grounds. It also has a level access ramp and automatic door at the main entrance, which is located at the front of the scheme.

Charles Jones Court consists of 67 properties; 28 are located in seven blocks of four within the grounds, and the remaining 39 are located in the scheme's main building.

There is a communal lounge, lift, laundry room and two overnight guest rooms for friends and family to stay.
