We also have lovely communal gardens for you to enjoy and a new greenhouse project starting.

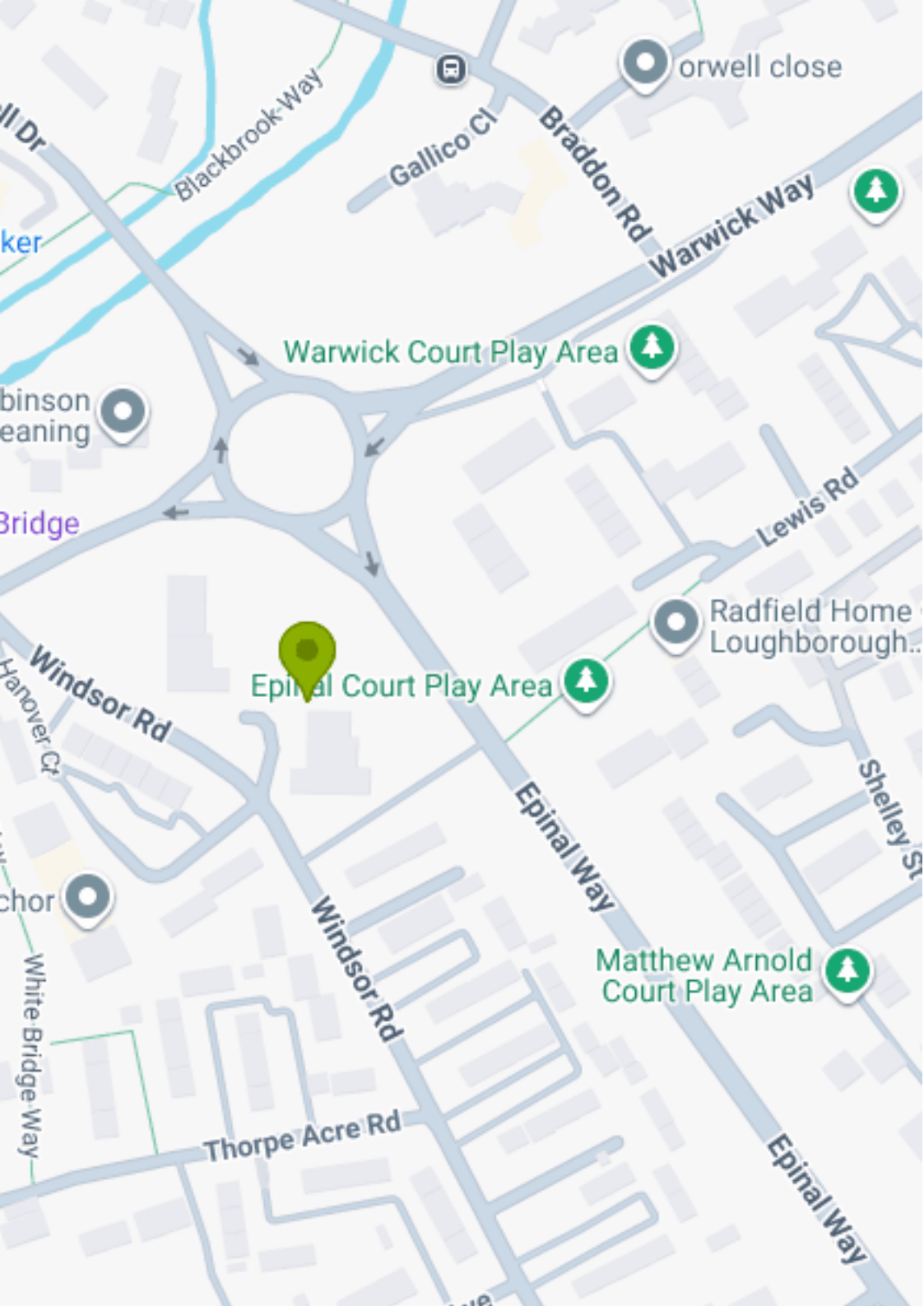
