The coast at Moreton is part of a stretch of sand that runs from Meols to Leasowe known as Mockbeggar Wharf, named after Mockbeggar Hall, otherwise known as Leasowe Castle.

The court is conveniently located just two minutes' walk from the nearest train station, while a bus stop outside the court connects residents with the shops, amenities and attractions of Birkenhead, Liverpool and the wider Wirral area.

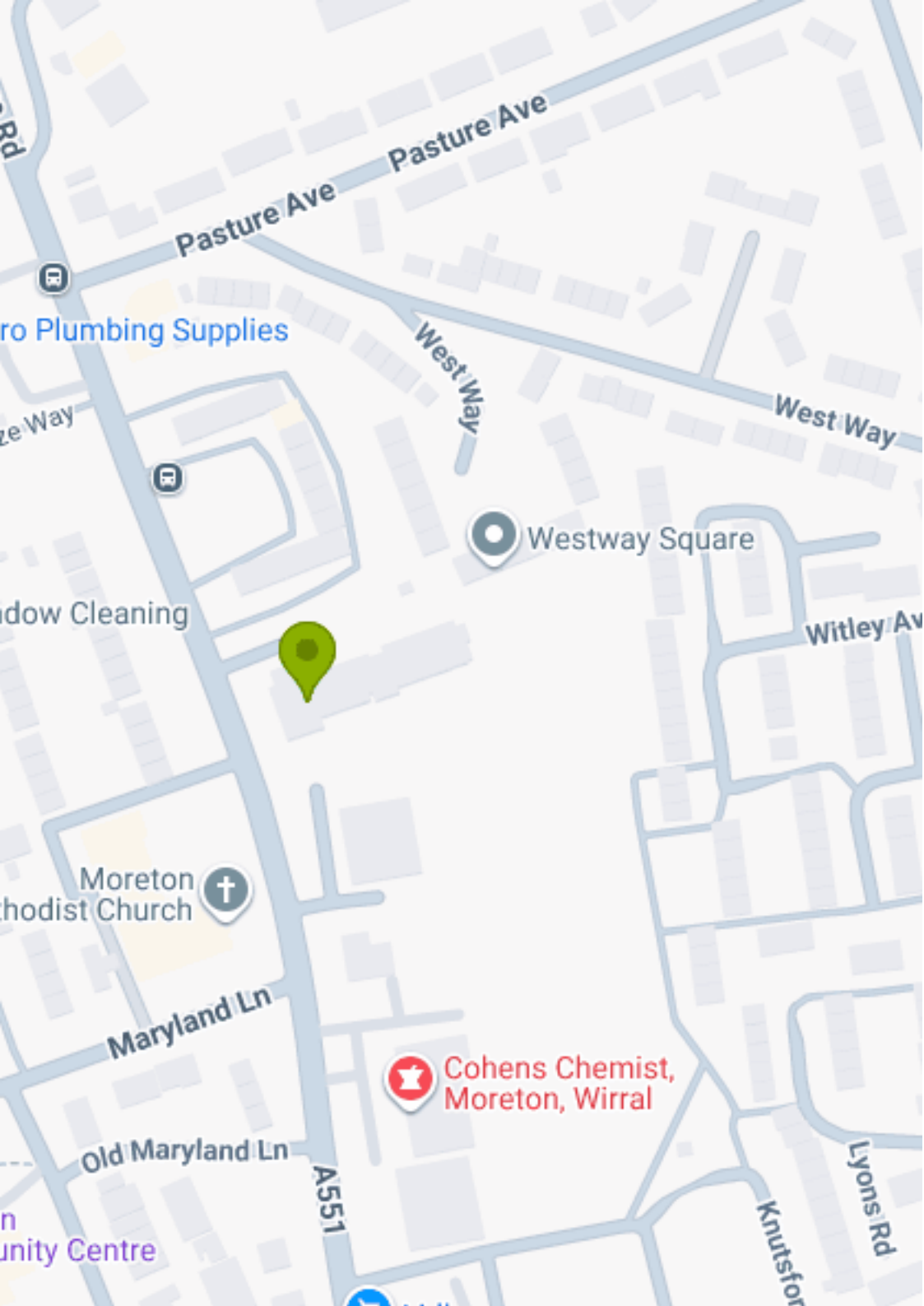
Maurice Jones Court has a range of onsite facilities including a large communal lounge, kitchen, hairdresser and guest room. There are new kitchens in all of the flats.
