Spring Bank Court sits in the Mill Hill suburb of Blackburn in Lancashire. The court is a short walk from a wide range of local amenities and transport links.

Mill Hill's bustling centre is within easy reach, where you will find a small supermarket, post office and bank. Takeaways, supermarkets, and retail parks and a pharmacy can be found nearby. Mill Hill also boasts a community centre, library, places of worship, a leisure centre and swimming pool.
