There are local shops and amenities situated in the village which is about a 10/15 minute walk away. There are also good transport links further afield, with two local rail stations giving access to Southport, Manchester, Preston and Ormskirk (for the Southport/Manchester line a bus service stops outside, connecting to the Burscough Bridge rail station, Burscough village and also to Ormskirk town).

Bretherton Court itself offers a total of 25 one bedroom properties. Bretherton is linked with Pardoe Court, immediately next door, which has a peaceful pond-garden.

The scheme has a pleasant communal lounge, laundry room and guest room. A mobile hairdresser visits the courts regularly. There is a 24 hour emergency call system and door entry system for your security.
