# Welcome

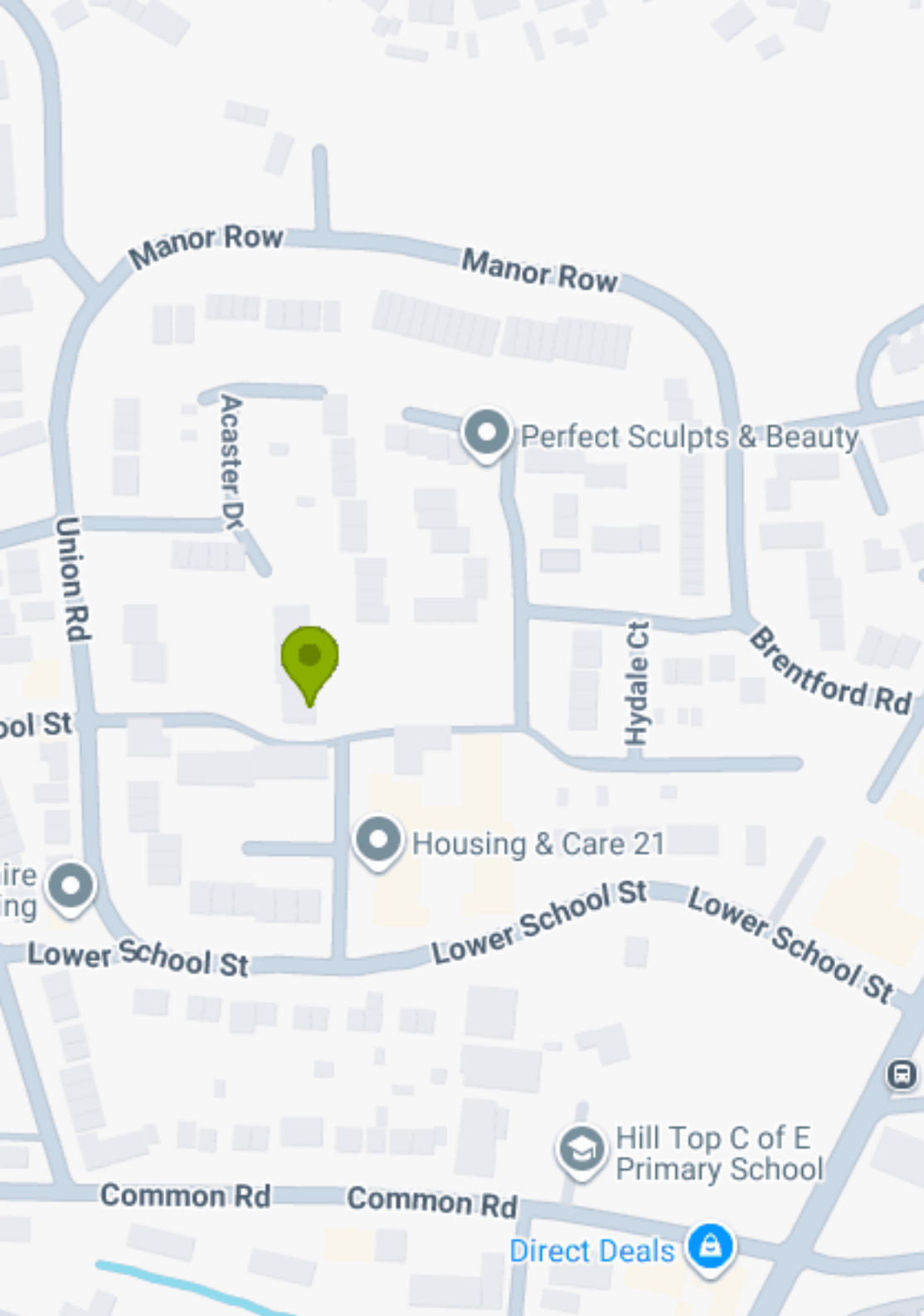
