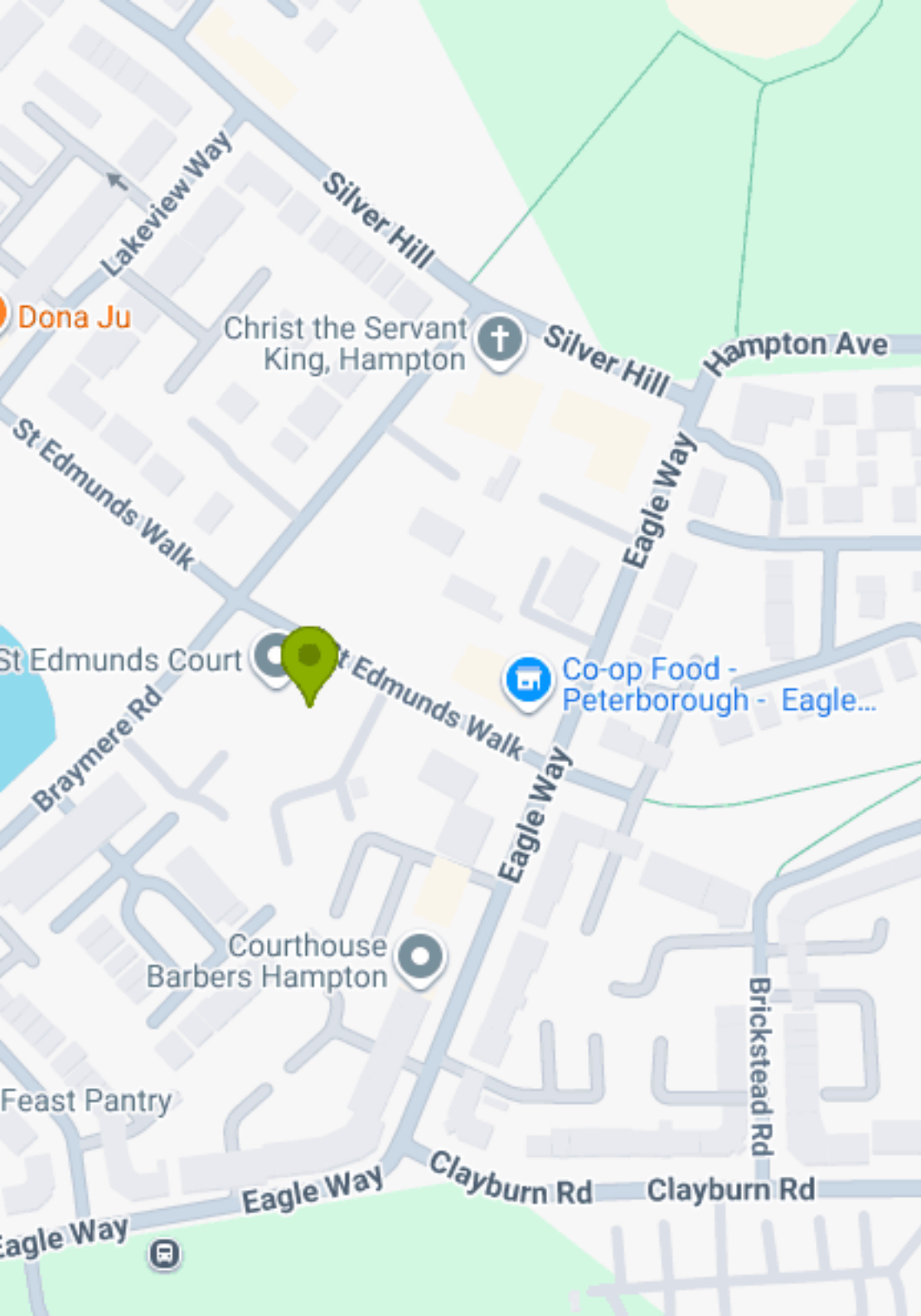
The court itself is set in extensive grounds which are well-maintained and offer level access for people with mobility difficulties. There is a dedicated Care team on-site 24/7.
