Stalham is a good centre for exploring the Norfolk Broads and is only 4 miles away from the nearest sandy beach. It is a typical country town with a High Street containing a range of shops and other facilities. Stalham is also home to a nearby Tesco supermarket and petrol station.

Stalham is a major boating centre and many boating holidays start from here. There are various day boats available for hire. The Staithe at Stalham is also home to the Museum of the Broads.

Seven miles north of Stalham is the market town of North Walsham where a train can be boarded for the Norwich to Cromer line.
