Hedley Davis Court is set just outside historic Salisbury, near to Stonehenge and the scene of John Constable's 'Water Meadows'.

Hedley Davis Court has recently had a complete makeover of all communal areas; facilities include a communal lounge, a guest room for visiting friends and family, and a laundry on-site. In the centre of the court there is a garden with a gazebo covered in wisteria and grapevines regularly attended by residents.

A social committee meets each month and residents take part in several activities including barbecues, music nights and quizzes. They also take trips out with the local coach company.

Every Tuesday and Saturday there is a market, and Salisbury has a selection of small independent shops and major supermarkets. A doctor's surgery, co-op and church are all a short walk from the court.

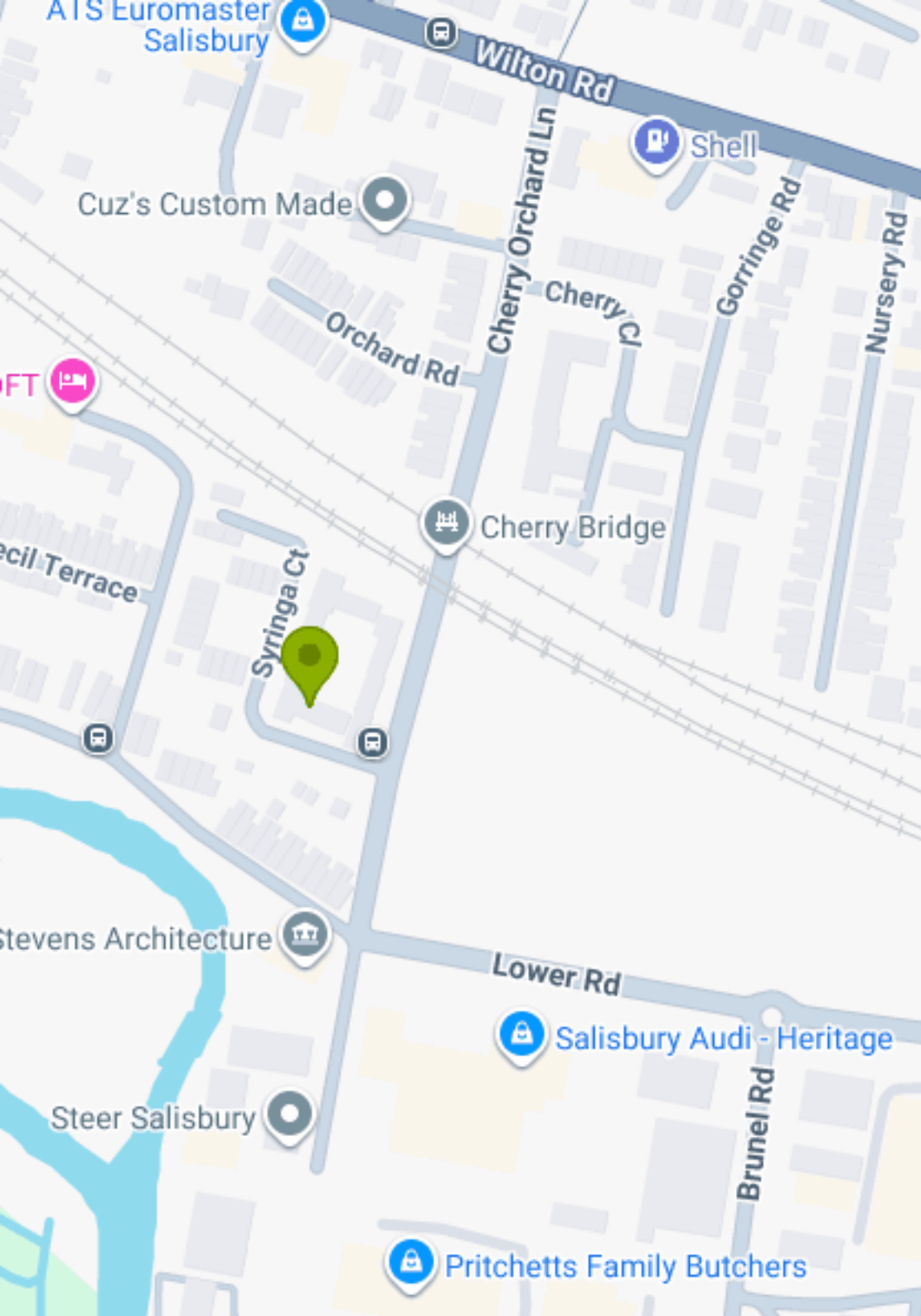
