On-site facilities include full-time court manager, restaurant, hairdressing salon, a small shop, communal lounges, a day care service and 24-hour care tailored to individual needs.

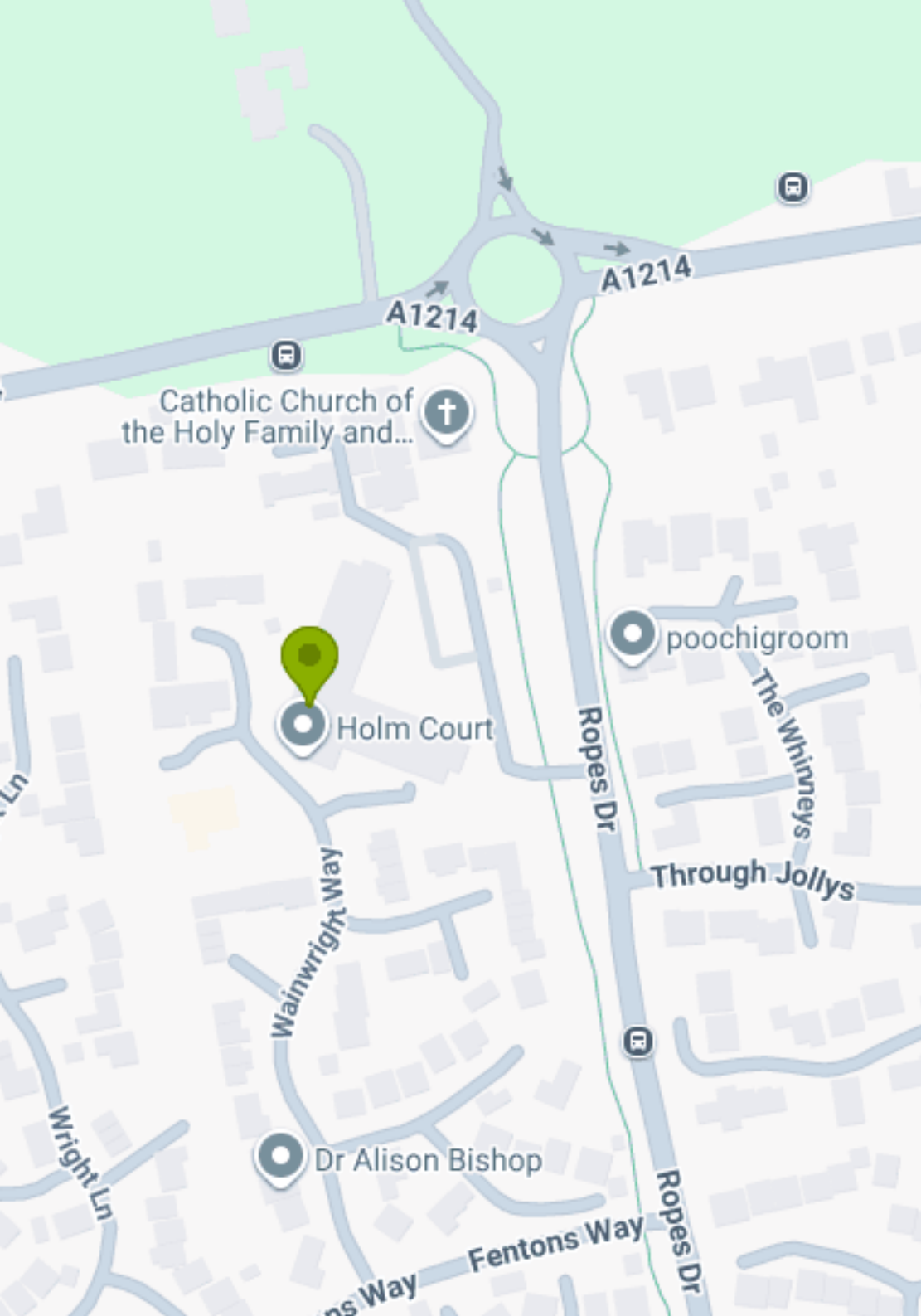
