The bus stop nearby will take you into the town centre within 15 minutes, where you will find a range of shops, cafes, pubs, restaurants and an excellent public library.

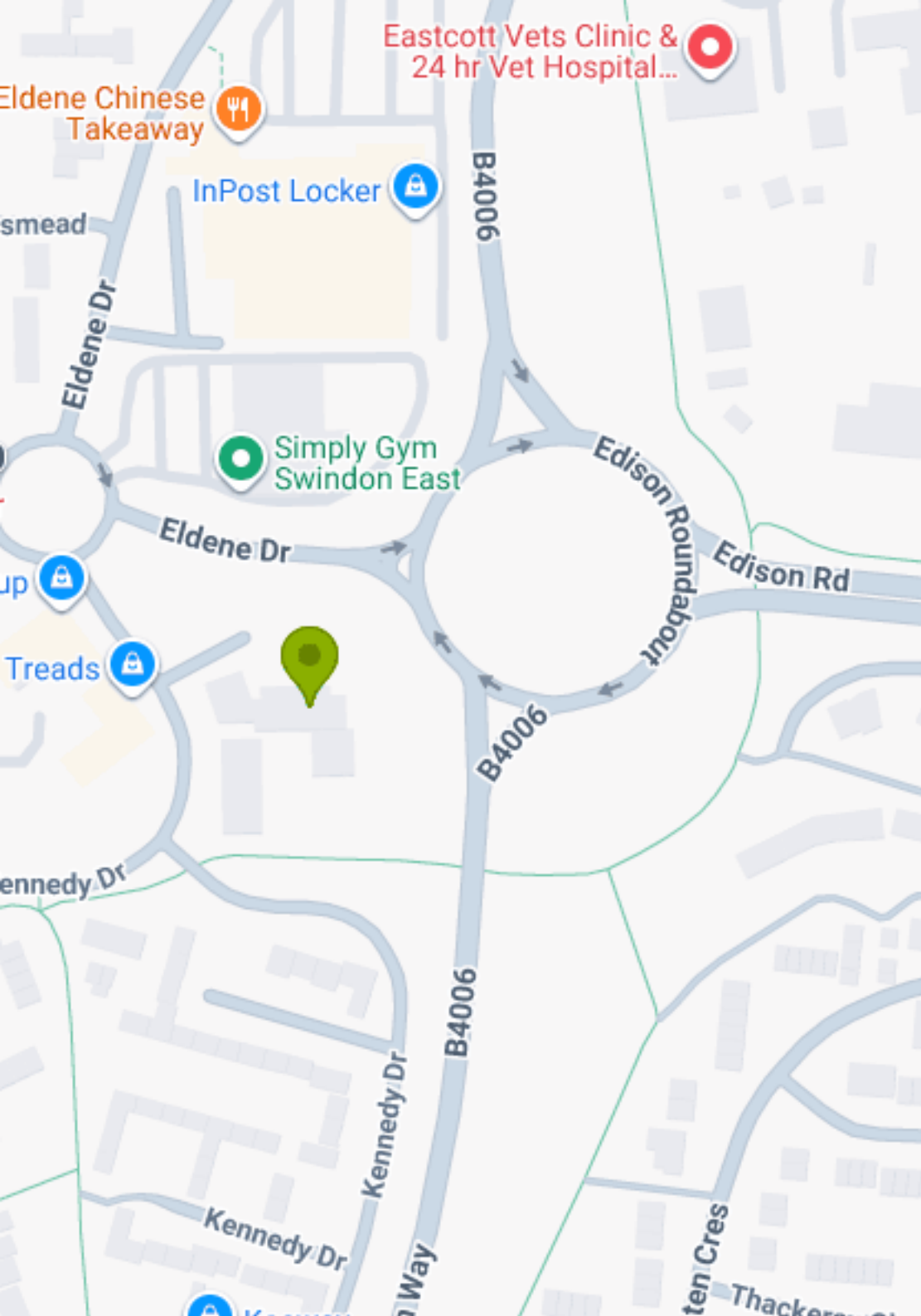
